INTRODUCTION

Mata Sahib Kaur College of Nursing, Mohali is run by the Management of Educational Society for Health Activities (ESHA) was established under the dynamic Leadership of our revered Chairman Lt. S. It is an institute where in addition to imparting modern Nursing Education, the devotional services rendered by Bhai Ghaniya's humanitarian spiritual philosophy are actively adhered to both theory and practice.

The ideal location of the college in aesthetic architectural grace on Chandigarh-Kharar Highway, about four Kms from sector 43 inter-state bus-terminus Chandigarh and about 1 Km from Mohali's present bus stand appeals to the visitor's nuances of the mind. Its spectacular building with grandiose construction in a plot measuring 9 acres of land becomes a soothing feast to the eyes. Mata Sahib Kaur college of Nursing offers G.N.M, A.N.M, OT and home care diploma courses in addition to degree in Nursing. The Post Basic B.sc (N) Program was started from session 2008-2009 with the approval of concerned authorities. B.Sc. Nursing (Basic) 4 years program started from the session 2009-2010. The M.Sc Nursing programme was started from session 2010-2012 in all 5 specialities of Medical Surgical Nursing, Community Health Nursing, Obstetrical & Gynecological Nursing, Psychiatric Nursing and Pediatric Nursing with the approval of concerned authorities.

The college academic block has spacious class rooms with latest educational technology, physical facilities required to develop a student physically, psychologically, socially, morally and emotionally. The laboratories has equipments of latest technology helping students to be at par with nurses of western countries to enable the student to attain the title of global nurse. Special Clinical Training in Mental Health care of mentally patients is being imparted at Dr. Vidya Sagar Govt. Mental Hospital, Amritsar. The students are also imparted Community Health Training in both Rural and Urban areas of mohali.

LIBRARY

The Library of the college is enriched with literature including good journals, magazines and books. There are large number of books related to Medicine, Surgery, Nursing, General Knowledge, Biology, Social Sciences and books related to spiritual learning. The college also provides facility of digital library on computers rendered by BFUHS..

ADMISSION SCHEDULE

The Admissions for this year are open **till** PNRC/GOVT. Notifications for ANM/GNM courses. For rest of the courses the admission shall be as per B.F.U.H.S schedule.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA (AS PER INC , BFUHS AND PNRC NORMS)

- M.Sc Nursing: B.sc Nursing/post basic B.Sc Nursing with experience 1 year either in teaching or clinical.
- B.Sc Nursing (Basic) 4 Years: 10+2 class pass with 45% aggregate in PCBE.
- B.Sc Nursing (Post Basic) 2 Years: G.N.M Pass.

GENERAL NURSING & MIDWIFERY (GNM) 3 YEARS

10+2 pass or its equivalent Examination from a recognized Board/University with minimum 45% marks in aggregate (Relaxable by 5% for SC & ST Candidates) Preference will given to candidates with Science subjects. Trained ANM candidate can also apply if they have passed 10+2 or its equivalent examination.

AUXILIARY NURSE & MIDWIFERY (ANM) 2 YEARS

10+2 pass or its equivalent Examination from a recognized Board/University with minimum 45% marks in aggregate (Relaxable by 5% for SC & ST Candidates) Preference will given to candidates with Science subjects.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED WITH APPLICATION

- Photocopy of Birth Certificate/Matriculation Certificate duly attested for proof of age.
- Photocopy of 10+2 Examination Certificate for GNM and Matric Mark Sheet for ANM (Two copies duly attested).
- Photocopy of Character Certificate from Principal of the last Institute/School/College attended.
- Domicile Certificate (2 copies)
- Schedule Caste and Schedule Tribe Certificate from Tehsildar or Sub-Divisional Magistrate if applicable (2 copies).
- Three-passport size photographs (one attested & two unattested). Additional 6 passport size photos unattested.
- Medical Fitness Certificate (2 Copies affixed on the Performa at the end).
- Declaration (Affixed on the Performa attached at the end).
- Affidavit duly signed by notary and parents along with photograph is required (Only four persons including father are allowed and their group photo is required along with affidavit).

PROCEDURE FOR FORWARDING AN APPLICATION

A candidate seeking admission in GNM/ANM Course shall apply on prescribed form appended at the end of this prospectus in his/her own hand writing.

Admission Fees including all required funds such as Laboratory, Library, Medical, Sport, Entertainment, Building, Welfare of students, Demonstration etc.

NOTE:

- All the charges are subject to revision at any time during the course.
- Student will have to pay for the uniform, books, Clinical & Transport charges separately.
- Students will have to pay examination fee & registration fee separately & fee is liable to change as per university norms.
- The college is affiliated to big hospitals and health centers in and around the city to provide a wide variety of practical learning experience to trainees. Whatever fee is revised by the respective Institute/Government for the purpose, shall have to be borne by the candidate.

THE SELECTED CANDIDATE WILL HAVE TO DEPOSIT THE ORIGINAL MATRICULATION / 10+2 CERTIFICATES FOR ITS VERIFICATION BY THE RESPECTIVE BOARDS/UNIVERSITY.

1. INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

This is based on the performance of the student in the classroom, Clinical areas and Community settings and Internal Examination in written, oral and Practical.

Note: 25% of marks of the Annual Council Examination are added from Internal Assessment marks. Candidate has to secure 50% marks in internal assessment in each theory and practical in order to be eligible for Council Examination.

2. P.N.R.C.EXAMINATION

The examinations of the Punjab Nurses Registration Council are held at the end of First, Second and Third year in the month of September/October each year. The examination for A.N.M at the end of 1st year, three papers- Community Health Nursing 1, Health Promotion, and Primary Health Care Nursing (Prevention of Disease and restoration of Health are to be conducted and three paper- Child Health Nursing, Midwifery and Health Center management will be conducted after completion of 1.5 year training period Minimum of 50% marks are required to pass the examination in each subject. Examination fees are to be paid by students as prescribed by Punjab Nurses Registration council

A certified operation theatre attendant can take gainful employment in government hospitals, private multi specialty hospitals and private Nursing homes.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Candidate should have passed 10th class with science or its equivalent examination.
- Candidate should have attained the age of 17 years or more as on 31st December of the year of admission.

GENERAL CODE OF CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE OF THE STUDENTS

- Fees are payable in advance. Fees and other charges once paid by the candidate are not refundable in full or in part on any account whatsoever.
- Cheques are not accepted. Only Bank Draft/I.P.O. payable in favour of the Director Mata Sahib Kaur College of Nursing, Mohali is accepted.
- ALL fees have to be paid within the stipulated period, failing which fine shall be levied. On very long delayed payments, admission can be cancelled.
- The discipline of Institute is to be strictly observed. For break of discipline a student may be fined or expelled from the Institute. No refund of fee will be allowed.
- Any harsh or insulting language written or verbal used in the premises may affect the continuity of training.
- If a student fails to take examination for one reason or other, the Institute will not entertain any claim for the refund of the fee.
- In all matters the decision of the Principal/Director will be final.
- Any dispute arising out of their transaction will be subject to S.A.S. Nagar jurisdiction only.
- Students are not permitted to possess any books, which excite Basic Instincts.
- Institute will not be responsible for delay or postponement of the examination by PN.R.C / B.FU.H.S.
- The Principal/Director reserves the right to change the Time Table at any time.
- Leave application is to be recommended through the class incharge/class teacher.
- The parents/Guardians should sign application.
- House Examinations/Tests are compulsory but sick student may remain absent by producing medical certificate & with the permission of Principal.
- Regular and Punctual attendance is Compulsory at class. Demonstrations Practical, Clinical training in Hospitals day & Night. 100% attendance is essential to be eligible to appear in the examination.
- College does not have any kind of responsibility of any student while going to Hospital/ Community experience or while going back home.

- A student whose progress and conduct is considered unsatisfactory, her name may be struck off at any time after giving due notice to her parents.
- Students will not be allowed to entertain their Parents / Guardians / Relatives / Friends during college hours.
- The Management is empowered to increase/change the fees and funds at any time during the session.
- If any student leaves the training before the stipulated training period on any ground whatsoever, she will have to pay the fees and other charges etc. for the full period of training.
- Any destruction done by the student to college furniture and educational media will be borne by the student.
- A student and her parents must thoroughly check her eligibility for admission into the courses.
- Educational tour for final year students are compulsory.
- The college authorities are taking all the precautions for proper care of students. However, the college will not be responsible for any unforeseen accident or death to any of student during training and stay at the college.
- **Ragging is totally banned. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if her explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel her from the Institute.**
- **Parents are requested to come and check the progress of their ward from the class teacher on any Saturdays.**

CLAUSE FOR SELF AUTHORITY

- For Post Basic B.Sc. (N) & M.Sc. (N) students self authority is permitted on duly signed affidavit and submitted by the parents is mandatory which will be revised yearly.



RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE HOSTEL

- Students should Co-operate in the upkeep of the Hostel and its surroundings.
- Rooms Should be kept clean and tidy; students are fully responsible for furniture supplied to them.
- Cup boards/Boxes should be properly locked. Jewellery and expensive items are not permitted.
- No student is allowed to bring costly items/ Jewellery etc. in the hostel, for loss of such items college will not be responsible.
- The Warden makes allotment of rooms but change can be made on after request: No change is allowed without the permission of competent authority.
- Water is available 24 hours but wastage and carelessness will render the students to disciplinary action.
- Relatives are not permitted in the rooms.
- Failure to return on time will be dealt seriously and strictly.
- In case of sickness, student should report to the class teacher during office hours and in the hostel to the warden.
- The Warden will censor all letters coming to the students.
- Parents/Relatives should visit the students on Sunday, from 9.00 a.m to 12.00 noon and 2.00 p.m to 5.00 p.m in visitors room only similarly 4.00 p.m to 6.00 p.m in Summer, 3.30 p.m to 5.00 p.m in winter on week days.
- Students are permitted to go home once in a month with their authorized guardian whose photo is given in the Affidavit.
- Training can be discontinued in case of Misconduct.
- Food will be served only in Mess and students are not allowed to carry the food to their rooms.
- Photograph of four relatives who can visit the student in the Hostel and two photographs of male relatives who may, in case of emergency can visit the day Scholar student during college hours, for day scholars should be given.
- Principal / Director are fully authorized to change the rules and regulations of the Hostel at any time in future.
- If any of the articles or furniture etc. is damaged by the student the cost of the damaged article will be recovered from student. If the student has not been identified, the recovery will be made from all in mates of the room or hostel in general.
- No student is allowed to leave hostel facility for entire course when enrolled.

Note : • Any query not covered by the above rules shall be decided by the management whose decision will be final in every respect.
